

without scavengers, who occupy climax trophic level of the food chain, the recycling or proper disposal of dead and decaying material is either stopped or delayed. Within last 20 years, Odisha has witnessed a drastic decline of vulture population, but there is no information on vulture population in Odisha. A detailed and systematic study is required to evaluate the population status of vultures in the state.
