

ADDITIONS TO THE BIRDS OF KUVEMPU UNIVERSITY CAMPUS, SHIMOGA DISTRICT, KARNATAKA

Kuvempu university campus is located 24km south east of Shimoga city, 4km north of Bhadra reservoir adjoining the stretches of the Bhadra Wildlife Sanctuary in the Western Ghats. Nazneen *et al.*, 2001 prepared a preliminary checklist of 94 species of birds based on the observations from November 1997 to December 2000. We are hereby updating the list by an addition of 41 species of birds studied from October 2000 to October 2001 in different ecotypes adjacent to the University administrative building area; methodology followed as of Nazneen *et al.* (2001). During the course of observation 135 species of birds were sighted. 41 species are new to the checklist of the University campus with 34 residential species and seven winter visitors.
